Dear Friends,

The early church grew fairly quickly despite the fact that this new religion was despised by many. We know that when Jesus died, the disciples were saddened and confused and quite frankly, scared. They spent a lot of time, hiding in their homes. But with Jesus' resurrection and the addition of the Holy Spirit, the disciples were emboldened to reach out to their community and share the Good News. You did not see them hiding in their houses any longer. They were out in the community, healing the sick, freeing the captives and following Jesus' mandate to "feed the sheep".

Two thousand years later, the church has gone through many ups and downs. There have been moments when the church was thriving and days like today, when the church is diminishing. The most frequent question I am asked by our churches, is how to grow our membership. How do we interest new folks in the life of the church?

This is of course a complicated question and there is no one simple answer. Yet, I think looking back to our beginnings does show us a few important insights. The first is, of course, that, the early church was not looking at how to grow the "church". The early church's purpose was to share the good news so that everyone would come to know the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Jesus did not instruct the disciples to grow a church, he told them to feed the sheep. The disciples understood this to mean, answering the physical and spiritual needs of the people, in the name of Jesus. The fact is that as they shared the love and grace of Christ, the church grew.

The accounts we read in Acts and the Epistles, show us a group of disciples who were intent on going out into the world to bring the good news to the people. We do not hear too many stories where folks were invited to attend a church service. The believers went out to find the people.

When I look at the early church and compare it to our efforts today, I see a mismatch. Have we forgotten that the mandate is to make disciples, not church members? Have we gotten so comfortable in our pews that we neglect to step out into the community? Don't get me wrong, I love our church buildings and the worship that we have within them. But I am afraid that we miss the point if we forget to leave our buildings. I suspect that growing the church means taking the brave step of leaving them behind so we can meet the needs of the people.

This summer, one of our churches, Hampden Highlands, is going out into the community to serve the people. Their Raya Mission is in full swing as they have raised money and will be dispersing teams to go to community members homes to offer small repairs and maintenance free of charge. They are not asking folks to attend a church service, but they are offering the love and grace of neighbors in the name of Jesus. I am excited to see the reverberations of this ministry in the months to come.

I hope to continue to share examples of best practices that I see in our churches over the months to come. I hope that you will pray for these efforts and perhaps find inspiration in them for your own ministries. I believe that as we step out to share the good news, to feed God's sheep, our churches will grow. I am convinced that when we give sacrificially to others, forgetting our own preferences, we will see growth in the church and in our own spiritual lives as well. I pray that your days will be filled with an overflowing abundance of God's love.

What's Cookin'

Judy Clossey Chicken Soup

Saute in 2-3 Tbsp Oil until Tender (15 mins+/-)
Veggies: 4 parsnips, chop ½", 4 ribs celery, sliced; 1 turnip (3/4#);

1 1/2C chopped onions; carrots,

1 Jalapeño pepper (seeded & chopped);

1T chopped garlic;

BROTH: 16 cup reduced fat, low-sodium chicken broth; 2tsp salt; ½tsp cayenne pepper; ¼ cup lemon juice; ¼ cup chopped fresh dill (2Tbsp dried)

ADD: 5-6 C cubed cooked chicken (7 cans -5 oz)

Broccoli & Spinach

Bring to Boil reduce heat & simmer (10 mins

*Frozen Veggies can used

*Recipe can be halved

Baked Oatmeal: Basic recipe

Preheat Oven to 375 F // Spray or Line an 8X8 pan with Parchment Paper

Mix Dry Ingredients: 2 cups Quick Oats; 1/4 cup Brown Sugar; 1/3 cup of Raisins or Dried Cranberries; 1 Tbsp Chopped Walnuts or Almonds; 1 tsp Cinnamon; 1 tsp Baking Powder

Mix Wet Ingredients: 11/2 cups Milk; 1/2 cup Applesauce; 2 Tbsp Butter Melted; 1 egg; 1/4 tsp vanilla

Add well mixed wet ingredients to the dry. Pour into greased/lined baking pan. Bake for 25-30 mins. or until center comes is slightly springy when tapped.

Experiment with different ingredients.

Just remember if you add more dry ingredients, you'll need to increase the amount of liquid.

Different Wet Ingredients I like to use
I usually increase the amount of Applesauce and milk when I add extra dry.
I like to make my own applesauce which has extra cinnamon in it.
I've used Honey or Maple Syrup instead of extra Applesauce.
I've used Evaporated Milk as well as Half & Half and Heavy Whipping Cream

Extra Dry Ingredients I like to add
I use at least a Tbsp of Cinnamon and a sprinkle or two of Nutmeg
Old Fashioned Oats (uncooked - for texture)
Organic Shredded Coconut;
Sunflower Seeds (unsalted); Pumpkin Seeds (unsalted); Flax Seed;
Mini Dark Chocolate morsels.
You could probably add frozen blueberries but I haven't
